

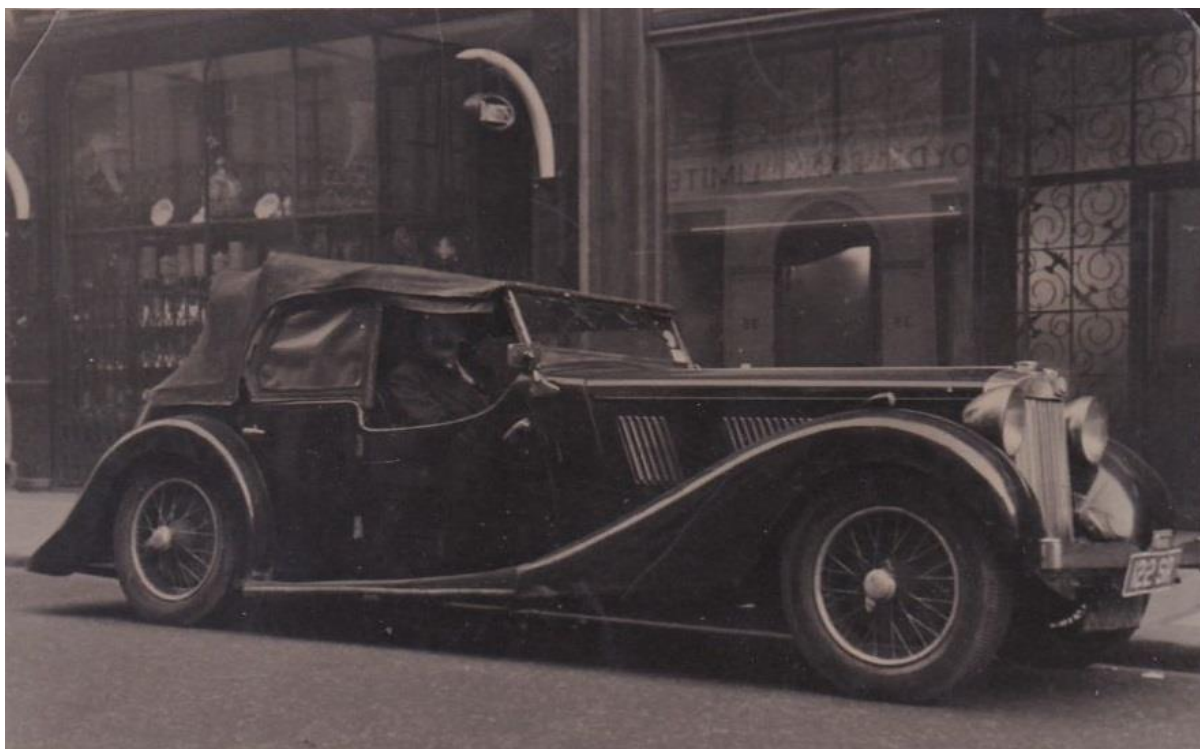

Our new Facebook group 'SVW Register' has attracted 87 members so far and they have posted some very interesting and unique content. Anyone interested in SVW MGs is welcome to join, so look for us if you're on Facebook.

Dick Morbey spotted this interesting picture on the Triple-M Register forum. He passed it to Jim Andrews who circulated it around the committee for comments. It's a rare WA Tourer and the photo seems to have been taken outside a branch of Lloyds Bank Limited (this can just be made out in the reflection), probably in the 1950s. The registration looks like 122 SR, a configuration that started in 1953. 'SR' was Dundee so it's likely to be somewhere in Scotland; perhaps someone may recognise the building. The Scottish connection leads us to think this is probably one of 8 WA Tourers ordered by The Glasgow Constabulary, the original registrations of which were CGE 183 to 190 incl. It was probably black and the rather tatty hood points towards a hard life, so it all fits together. Perhaps that police force had a policy of re-registration of police cars when sold on, unlike my own ex-police VA Tourer, which still carries the original registration and even the original number plates!

Writing this in early October, I have no idea where the months have gone, but looking back at the year we have done quite a lot. My last planned classic car event is on October 14<sup>th</sup>, although there are still the monthly MG and VSCC meetings which can still be enjoyable on crisp winter days. New Year's Day has become a traditional time to take an old car out.
